My Brothers All,

Unfortunately, I was hopeful that my next communication to you would have been more uplifting and positive, but due to ongoing increased developments with the Coronavirus ( COVID-19 ) and the escalation of government directives and executive orders, imposed quarantines, limitation of assembly, and the overall concern for all our health and welfare, the following actions will be taken as follows:

The directive issued on March 13th, 2020, that all Grand Lodge, Blue Lodge and Appendant Bodies meetings, activities and events, be hereby canceled until March 31st, 2020, will hereby be extended until April 30th, 2020. Exceptions will be Masonic funerals and Blood Drives conducted under the supervision, direction and adherence of practices of the American Red Cross. Worshipful Masters and Officers may continue to pay bills, handle normal correspondences and building maintenance, as needed.

Our Annual Communication at Bally's Atlantic City Hotel and Casino, scheduled for April 22nd and 23rd, has been canceled. Official Receptions for the month of April have been postponed. The three Candidates nights scheduled for April will be held if possible, prior to the rescheduled Annual Communication. Dates are to be determined. In agreement with the Elected Line, the intent is to schedule and hold our Annual Communication, Election of Grand Lodge Officers, and Installation, as soon as possible when the current crisis subsides and allows.


Voting for Grand Lodge contested Offices, and the Grand Lodge Budget will be available to all Grand Lodge voting members, Past Masters, Worshipful Masters and Wardens, online. Voting will coincide with the Annual Communication, when determined. Registration for online voting will be extended. A directive will be forthcoming from the Grand Lodge Office about online voting in anticipation of your questions and concerns. Videos will be made and posted of the Candidates' statements to the Grand Lodge website. The New Jersey Freemason magazine, containing the bios and statements of the Candidates, has gone to press and will be in the mail ASAP.

I have requested the Information Services and Technology Committee to provide information pertaining to various interacting media venues available to assist the Worshipful Masters and Lodges to communicate with each other. The Grand Educator will be providing more educational information and services to the Grand Lodge website for your further enlightenment. Let us continue to do what we do best, help and support each other. Your Grand Lodge Office will remain open and has been working very hard for you; and is there for any and all of your needs.

I am very proud of us all and find it very difficult, as I am sure you do, that in a time like this we all normally rally together physically and get things done. We cannot do that this time, and the uncertainty is very frustrating. We have a rough and rugged road to travel before us, and we must put our faith in God. Please follow all the advice and directives that we are getting and keep yourself and all our families out of harms reach. God bless us all.





Brethren,

I am sure you are all well aware of the extensive news coverage and the closely monitoring of the Coronavirus and its spread to some areas of the United States, including the Tri-state area. It is very important that we are proactive and very conscious of our surroundings and personal well being, when dealing with this potential outbreak of this virus.

The Health Departments across the state and country are working with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention to identify people who may have been exposed to the virus, monitor potential cases and engage health care providers, community partners and the public.

Leading health care experts have stated that if you are not in an area where COVID-19 is spreading, or if you have not traveled from one of those areas or have not been in close contact with someone who has and is feeling unwell, your chances of getting COVID-19 are very low. Individual risk really depends on your exposure. The U.S. expects to detect more cases of COVID-19 through travel as well as spreading from person to person. We can also take personal measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19.

So, what should you know and try to do to minimize your exposure and protect yourself and family from this virus :

Similar to the flu, COVID-19 is a respiratory virus that can cause the following symptoms:

- \* Fever
- \* Cough
- \* Shortness of breath

The symptoms may appear in as few as two days or as long as 14 days after exposure. Reported illnesses have ranged from people with minor to no symptoms to people being severely ill and some dying - again, similar to the flu.

COVID-19 can be transmitted in the following methods :

- \* Through the air by coughing or sneezing;
- \* Through close personal contact, such as touching or shaking hands;
- \* By touching an object or surface with the virus on it; and
- \* Occasionally, through fecal contamination.

The best ways to protect yourself include:


- \* Cover coughs or sneezes with a tissue or cough or sneeze into your elbow, not your hands.
- \* Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth to prevent spreading germs.
- \* Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- \* Clean surfaces frequently, including countertops, light switches, cell phones, remotes, computer keyboards, door handles and other frequently touched items.
- \* If you are sick, stay home until you feel better. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.



# Grand Lodge Electronic Balloting

## Registration Procedure, Deadline Tuesday, April 7<sup>th</sup>

**P**er the Constitution & Laws, Past Masters (PM) may cast their ballots for elected Grand Lodge offices (Title 3, Article IV, Section 2, Part 1) using an Internet connection. This article outlines the process that must be followed in order to vote at a location **other than** the Balloting & Registration Room at the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge in Atlantic City. You may vote from any device (desktop, tablet, mobile) that has an Internet connection and Web browser.

**You MUST REQUEST AN OFF-SITE BALLOT by PRE-REGISTERING.**

To pre-register, you must send an e-mail by **11:59pm Eastern Time, Tuesday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020** to **GLNJVOTING@GMAIL.COM** containing:

- Your full name
- Your e-mail address
- Your Member Number (found on your dues card or through your Lodge Secretary)
- NJ Lodge Name/Number

Once your eligibility is verified by the CLC office (which may take a few days), you will receive a confirmation e-mail stating that you are successfully registered. Then, on the morning of Wednesday, April 22nd, you will receive an e-mail with an encrypted link that will take you to the appropriate webpage to vote. This e-mail will also contain additional information and instructions. **Registration for off-site voting will close at 11:59pm Eastern Time on Tuesday, April 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020.**

**B**alloting will begin at approximately 9:00 noon on Wednesday, April 22nd until sometime between 9:00am and 10:00am Thursday, April 23rd (all times Eastern). Once balloting starts, an e-mail will be sent to those who have registered reminding them that the ballot is now open. **OFFSITE *BALLOTING MAY BE DONE AT ANY TIME WHILE BALLOTING IS OPEN IN ATLANTIC CITY.*** Please note that the times for the start and end of off-site voting are variable depending on when the Grand Master starts and stops balloting on-site. Off-site balloting will end at the same time as on-site balloting. **Please do not take a chance and wait until the last minute – vote before 9:00am on Thursday!**

You may request an off-site ballot if you are a PM of any lodge in a recognized jurisdiction **and** a member in good standing of a Lodge under the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of New Jersey, F&AM. Please note that the WM, SW and JW must cast the vote assigned to their office on-site (per C&L). If the WM, SW or JW is also a PM (previous year) and they are not able to attend the Annual Communication, they may only cast their PM vote off-site and must follow the procedure above to register for that ballot.



# Masonic Profile: Amos Kairouz

**A**MOS MUZYAD YAQOOB KAIROUZ, was one of ten siblings. He was born on January 6, 1912 in Deerfield, Michigan to parents Charles and Margaret, who were Maronite Lebanese Christian immigrants from Lebanon. He was raised in Toledo, Ohio, where he attended Woodward High School and the University of Toledo. The 1920 and 1930 U.S. Censuses list him as **Amos Jacobs**, living in Toledo. In 1932 he began performing in radio, on Detroit's WMBC, under his anglicized birth name, **Amos Jacobs Kairouz**. By 1940 he had moved to Chicago. Because he did not want his family to know that he was working in clubs (in order to earn a better salary), he created the name by which we all know him today — **DANNY THOMAS** — using the names of two of his brothers.

Throughout the 1930s and 40s, Thomas enjoyed an increasingly successful radio and film career, but really came into the public eye, somewhat literally, with his tremendously successful television show, *Make Room for Daddy*, later called simply, *The Danny Thomas Show*, which enjoyed an eleven year run (1953-1964) in its original incarnation. He went on to a tremendously successful career as a performer and producer, teaming with Sheldon Leonard and Aaron Spelling, among others, to produce such classic American hit TV shows as *The Dick Van Dyke Show* (for which he recommended unknown Mary Tyler Moore to Carl Reiner), *The Andy Griffith Show*, *That Girl* (starring his daughter Marlo Thomas), and *The Mod Squad*, through the 1950s and 60s. With actor Walter Brennan alone, he produced three hit series, *The Real McCoys*, *The Tycoon*, and *The Guns of Will Sonnett*.

Thomas' career continued to escalate through the 1970s and beyond as he continued to produce, and appear in many different shows and commercials.

**I**n the earliest days of his career as a struggling actor, Thomas had made a vow to open a shrine to St. Jude Thaddeus, the patron saint of hopeless causes, if he ever achieved suc-

cess. Having done just that, by the 1950s, he began travelling the country with his wife to raise funds to build St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, which was founded in 1962 in Memphis, Tennessee. St. Jude's treats children from all over the U.S. and from around the world in its mission of finding cures and saving children. It's immunology department was instrumental in making key discoveries on how the immune system works to kill virus-infected cells.



His continuing role in founding and supporting St. Jude's cemented Thomas' reputation as one of our foremost philanthropists.

**A**ccording to internet sources, Danny Thomas was initiated into Freemasonry in Prudence Lodge No. 958, Chicago, Illinois, with no certain year given. What is certain is that he was passed and raised to the sublime degree in Gothic Lodge No. 270 F.&A.M., in Hamilton Square, New Jersey, on March 15, 1984, by special dispensation of the Grand Master of New Jersey. His entry in the list of Famous New Jersey Masons presented in the History of Freemasonry in New Jersey, 1787-1987, appears as follows:

**DANNY THOMAS (AMOS JACOBS) (1912- ) Philanthropist, Humanitarian. Star of Stage, Screen, Television. Recipient of the Congressional Gold Medal of Honor in 1984. Lodge: Gothic 270. Residence: Beverly Hills, California**

Because he was a resident of California at the time he was made a Master Mason in New Jersey, the event caused a rift between the two respective Grand Lodges, resulting in the California Grand Lodge withdrawing its recognition of the New Jersey Grand Lodge, fortunately, for a brief and temporary period of time.

In May 1985, Danny Thomas was made a 32° Mason, and was also made a Noble in Al Malai-kah Shrine in Los Angeles.

**D**anny Thomas died of heart failure in Los Angeles on February 6, 1991, shortly after his 79th birthday, and only two days after celebrating the 29th Anniversary of St. Jude's. He is interred, along with his wife since 1936, Rose Marie Mantell, in a mausoleum on the grounds of the hospital.

The many honors earned by and bestowed upon Danny Thomas both during and after his illustrious and exemplary life include an eponymous park and monument in Toledo, Ohio; Danny Thomas Boulevard, in Memphis, Tennessee, which passes through the St. Jude's campus; his star on Hollywood Boulevard's Walk of Fame; the Bob Hope Humanitarian Award; and a U.S. Postal Service "forever stamp" honoring his life as an entertainer and humanitarian.






